Nicaragua Alert

April 18, 2018, will go down in history in Nicaragua. On that day, citizens initiated protests against the government. In the months since, over 350 have died, over 1500 have sustained injuries and a large number have been incarcerated, even while most protests are peaceful. Counted amongst the dead

are children as young as 10 months old, youth and young adults. The international community is in almost unanimous agreement that government forces are to blame for the majority of the atrocities.

Citizens are generally unarmed. Protests have

included marches, national strikes and construction of roadblocks. Food and fuel supplies have dwindled.

This story has not been prominent in the Canadian news media. We encourage you to refer to multiple reliable sources of information on-line.

The U.S. and Canada have

imposed travel restrictions. All travel to the Skylark Centre was suspended at the end of April. It has been necessary for local groups to cancel scheduled bookings.

The country is operating in a suspended state while we wait, watch, and pray.

The Skylark Impact



The Skylark Centre is a one-hour drive from the capital city of Managua in the province of Carazo. Nearby are the towns of San Marcos, Jinotepe and Diriamba, all of which have seen extensive and dramatic activity. The

Centre, off the main road, remains safe, as does the small Los Medranos community in which it is located. We continue to support as many staff as possible as they maintain and secure the grounds and run programs for local

participants who can safely attend “Best Start in Christ” programming, as staff are able to safely travel to Skylark.

All local and international group activity ceased in May.

April Medical Team

This was a team of troopers! Never had we faced the new challenges that awaited this team of medical professionals and students as the civil unrest was ramping up—from limited medication supply

to unavailability of translators. Through it all, and more, they were able to see almost 400 patients. For many of the local residents, this will be the last medical personnel they will see for some

time.
